In year 3 you will need to write a 10,000 word report  
If stated then there are 'tolerances' - they will  
apply some assessment criteria.

It is ~~good~~ good to assist one another - proof reading and  
giving advice to your peers is fine - for example identifying  
that a graph lacks labels; frequent errors, lack of  
capitals etc.

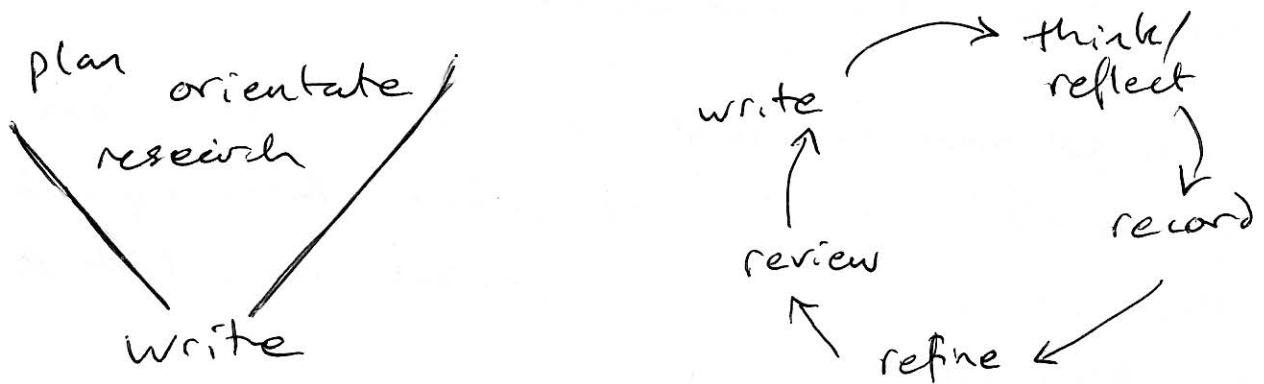
organise writing clearly, logically, and ideally elegantly -  
when citing an author, don't just put their info in brackets,  
but introduce their work - "in their seminal paper  
presented to the 1999 conference at the Hague,  
Professors ... and ... explained how...."

It is unrealistic that you can leave your work to the  
last minute - you will need to revise your work,  
both structurally and down to the fine detail of spelling  
and punctuation.

Technical report to be written in the passive voice.  
Citations should always be in the present - the papers still exist on the library shelves, so the convention is that Einstein says (despite his death).

When <sup>quoting</sup> ~~quoting~~, maintain US english, but otherwise convert information from online sources to British english (color → colour).

first draft will never be good enough so revise -  
but don't miss deadline, the penalty is large,  
good practice to submit draft early so at least  
something is there in case there are issues when  
everyone tries to submit at the last minute.

There is no problem with submitting more than once.

OK to work collaboratively (Pinterest/scoop to  
collect references)  
but the actual report is  
for you alone to write.

People who are rushed may take shortcuts, feel  
panicked and make poor choices.
