

This was a short session from Elena highlighting common issues with the submitted CVs:

- While most made at least a reference to the job position that they were applying for, this is a start but really the CV should **directly** reflect the requirements for the job.
- There is no need to use complete sentences and definately avoid large blocks of text the employer want to be able to skim the CV and a large block of text looks like work for them.
- Showing commitment to an activity sport or hobby that helps show that you can organize your life including this.
- Most people used the supplied (or an alternative) CV template. A few worked from scratch. Be careful that your CV looks professional with a clean, modern layout.
- It was difficult to demonstrate skills for those without a work history therefore reference the University modules or personal projects that confirm those skills.
